Transition from Professional to Educator

Challenges experienced by allied health practitioners transitioning into educator roles in post-secondary institutions are well reported in the literature. Allied health faculty tend to retain their 'health' identity as their *primary* professional identity alongside that of educator, which can have the effect of making their transition experiences, and their adoption of education as their new, meta profession, difficult and stressful. In particular, allied health faculty report confusion and discomfort when they feel they must choose between the obligations demanded of them by their health profession versus the obligations demanded of them by their educational program. Educational leaders can (and have a responsibility to) play an important role in assisting allied health faculty to adjust to their dual identities. It would be to the benefit of not just our faculty, but also to our students and our organizations, if we, as educational leaders could better marshal the supports these faculties need in order to become expert educators.
